#### COLIN PENNOCK

Colin Pennock is a *mid career* artist who paints abstract landscapes from his home in the Noosa hinterland, Queensland. He has exhibited widely in solo and group shows in Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide, New York and London. He is represented in London by *Serena Morton*, Ladbroke Grove.

He came to painting and drawing from unlikely beginnings as a Police Constable in Northern Ireland, sketching whilst on duty in the height of the troubles. These sketch books earned him a four year scholarship to St. Martin's School Of Art London from 1985-89 earning a BA Hons Fine Art – Painting.

Pennock uses his extensive knowledge of techniques to paint varied textural applications, from thick impasto to delicate glazing. His uniquely original style was born from the desire to find harmony a home, amidst chaos and discord, surrounded by the nurturing beauty of the sub tropical Noosa hinterland.

His recent solo shows *Intrusion* and *Silenced* stemmed from the artist's sense of being overwhelmed by intrusive events, the loss of loved ones, which made the artist withdraw from the influence of the outside world.

He has strong links to New York, exhibiting there in 1998 with Willie Doherty and Robert Longo at the **Culture & Conflict** exhibition at *Puffin Gallery* in 1998.

He first exhibited in London in 1988 with *Loewe & West Contemporary Arts* in Chelsea Wharf. More recently, he has shown with *Serena Morton* - at the launch of her new gallery space *Grand Opening* in 2014, *Start Of The Season* 2017 and *The London Art Fair 2018*.

His most recent solo show *Silenced* opened on 15 November 2017, at Scott Livesey Galleries in Melbourne, and ran till 09 December 2017.

#### Self Portrait - Artist's Statement

'As a child I lived in both Ireland and Australia. When I was 12 in 1976 my family bought an Irish farm. Still thinking of Australia, my first paintings I made as a child were an elevated view out of my bedroom window on that farm.

In 1985 after a number of turbulent years as a policeman in N. Ireland I went to St. Martin's Art School in London. Despite the change I found myself obsessively painting landscapes familiar to me in my past in Ireland and Australia. These landscapes contained both Irish hills with Australian gum trees and surreal skies. A sense of both places.

My landscapes over time have travelled. In the past I have described them as a direct link to my own life. They are journals of my emotional place - a diary.

Like looking in the mirror - A self portrait. I live in them.'

"Like an expert time traveller, Pennock slides effortlessly between memories and reality, and it is this contiguity between past and present that infuses each work with its timeless and elusive appeal. Every painted mark is a recollection - an imprint of a meaningful experience - and in this way each painting becomes a mnemonic trace of the artists life. Distance is measured in time and not physical space, and Pennock captures this continuum of time through his controlled variations of mark making and depth of field. The marks vary not only in colour and size, but also in type; from the epiphanic and confident, to the pensive and calm. Here, each stroke of paint is like a footprint, stepping forth from Pennock's past into the present, and this narrative pervades his creative output...

Navigating through Pennock's sumptuous layering of colour and visceral application of paint, the viewer catches glimpses of things that appear, disappear and reappear in an oscillating cycle of revelation and concealment, much like the glimmer of a memory unearthed from the depths of the past."
