Stoney Darkstone's work exist between fashion and art. It is neither reality or fantasy. Not figurative or abstract. It's between the digital universe and the real world. Is sensitive and fierce. Sensual and strong.

Darkstone challenges our notions of reality, beauty and femininity. A successful fashion photographer, he pursued a parallel world creating his art that increasingly distorted the nude and challenged twenty-first century conventions of beauty.

The tools of contemporary fashion and social media platforms have seen channelled into Darkstone's neoteric vision. He manipulates not to deliver perfection but rather, to distort. The work invites us into a new parallel world.


The nude becomes a vehicle for his ideas. Here the female form elongates and becomes almost superhuman. She is strong and proud of her nakedness. She is an alpha woman.

Whereas fashion conventions of beauty remove the essence of the human being, Darkstone's art breathes life into their limbs and skin. His use of wind and light re-imbues the human form with life and energy, glitches and a sense of pure soul.

Darkstone started creating his artwork for Instagram. It never occurred to him until recently that his art should take a physical, printed form. After all, his audience is used to seeing his images through a screen, and be criticized with "likes" and "comments". He is incredibly excited by the fact that now his visual language is shapeshifting into a physical medium.

Working in collaboration with gallerist and curator Serena Morton, Darkstone's work was brought into the fine art arena for the first time this year.



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



